
Register now

Visual Arts at Movelle – Term Fun and Creativity!

It's been a wonderfully creative term in the Visual Arts room at Movelle Primary School! Across all year levels, students have been exploring new materials and techniques while using their imagination and problem-solving skills to bring their ideas to life.

Our Prep students have been working on beautiful mixed media collages of the cow jumping over the moon. They've enjoyed experimenting with shapes, colour and layering as they retold the classic nursery rhyme through art.

In Year 1/2, students created striking silhouette artworks of children standing under umbrellas, using dripping food dye to simulate colourful rain. They've now moved on to designing their very own 3D donuts, planning everything from icing designs to toppings!

Our Year 3/4 artists have also been working in 3D, transforming their cupcake designs into sculptural artworks. Students are now building their 3D cupcakes with a focus on structure, texture and decoration. The results are already looking delicious!



Meanwhile, the Year 5/6 students have taken their creativity to the next level by designing and constructing large 3D cardboard cakes. These imaginative cake sculptures will be covered in Modroc for strength and texture. Students will then use paper clay to create decorations like cream swirls, strawberries and cherries to complete their masterpieces.

It's been inspiring to see students take risks, think like designers and celebrate their unique ideas. We can't wait to display these stunning creations around the school!

The Prep students started off Term 3 with a BANG and celebrated 100 days of school. We had the best day filled with joy, creativity, dancing and activities centred around the number 100. We made fruit loop necklaces; decorated frames and they had their parents and/or family members come in to decorate cupcakes at the end of the day. It was beautiful to see the classroom filled with all the children's special people; it was a day to remember.

Preps have been busy during Literacy lessons with tasks focused on fluency in their reading and writing. They have come such a long way in their sentence writing, with some of our preps writing their own sentences all by themselves making sure our sentences have SWAG. We have started our multiples in LEM and they are making us very proud with how well they are learning all the tricky rules on our English language. We are working hard this term on our reading being more fluent, practicing every day during our independent reading time.

In Numeracy we have been very busy learning about addition and subtraction. We have been using a lot of concrete materials and game-based resources to consolidate our learning. They have again blown us away with how fast they are learning these concepts.

Keep up the amazing work Preps, you make us very proud and grateful to be apart of your learning journey. Reminder to families to practice reading with your child every night, when possible, to support their growing reading abilities.

Year 1/2

We've had a busy and exciting start to the term! In the first week back, the Year 1/2 students celebrated their 100th day of school with great enthusiasm. They took part in a range of fun and creative activities to mark the milestone, including craft activities and math games.

In English, we've begun an author study on Nick Bland. Students are learning to use prediction strategies by drawing on text clues and their prior knowledge and are making meaningful connections to their own lives.

In Mathematics, students have been exploring the names and properties of 2D and 3D shapes, such as vertices, sides, and parallel lines. They particularly enjoyed hunting for shapes in the classroom environment and practised drawing and making these shapes.

In Writing, students have started planning their ideas for story writing, with a focus on using a clear sequence of events. They will work through the full writing process of prewriting, drafting, revising, editing, and publishing to bring their stories to life.

Year 3/4

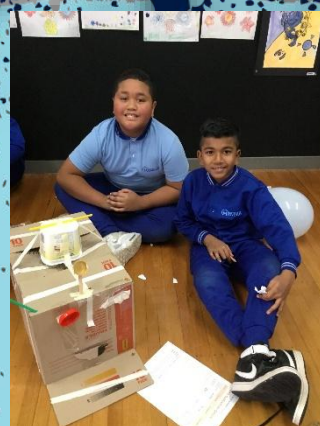
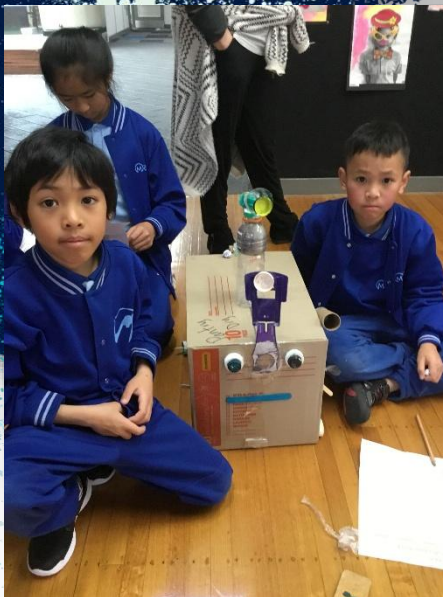
Welcome back to an exciting Term 3!

In English, we have begun a Film Study on The Lion King. The students have been working on character profiles and building their vocabulary on physical and personality traits as well as feelings and actions. They have used Venn diagrams to compare and contrast different characters in the movie as well as characters in their own reading. Students have also started to explore how we 'Make Connections' when we are reading and viewing. They

have learnt that there are three different connections: Text to world, Text to text and Text to self.

In Mathematics, students have been learning the names and properties of 2D shapes and learnt that a polygon is any shape that is 'closed and has straight sides'. They refined their knowledge on vertices, sides, parallel lines, curves, edges and angles. The students enjoyed making 'composite shapes' and worked on finding the line of symmetry on shapes and various objects.

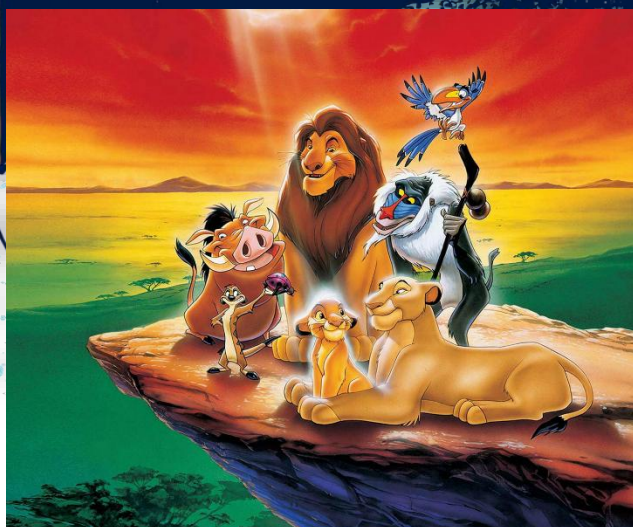
For the next two weeks we will be focusing on multiplication. All of the students have been given a laminated times tables chart to take home so please encourage them to practise their times tables whenever they can with you. They can display it on the fridge, in their room or somewhere where they can see it regularly.

A new homework grid has also been given to your child. Please support them in completing one homework task from the grid every week (in their homework books), as well as doing their reading and spelling practice.

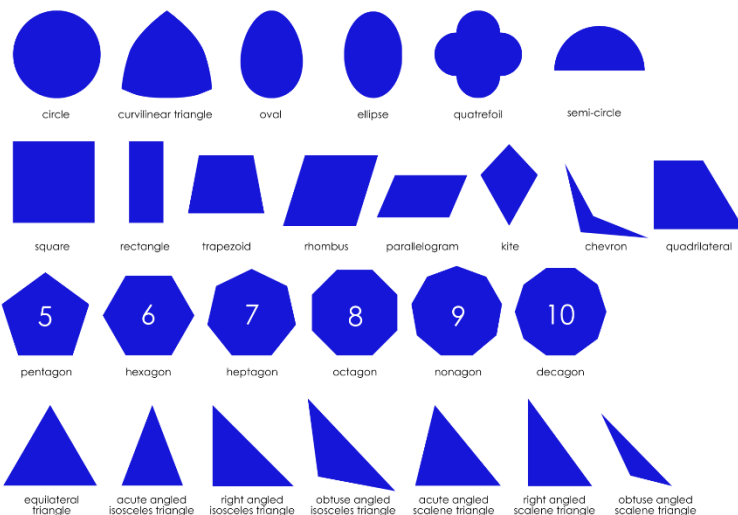

Year 5/6

Year 5/6 Learning Update – Term Highlights!

It's been a busy and exciting time in Year 5/6, with students diving deep into new texts, big ideas and creative learning across all areas.



In Reading, we've been exploring *Lion: A Long Way Home*. Students have been reading closely to answer comprehension questions, make thoughtful predictions, and connect the character's experiences to their own lives. We've also been discussing the different settings and how they influence Saroo's journey, as well as how characters respond to challenges in different ways.

In Writing, we've launched our Word Choice Unit, where students are learning to sharpen their writing by choosing the most effective words. They've been experimenting with powerful nouns, vivid verbs, precise adjectives, and adventurous adverbs. We've also explored figurative language like similes, metaphors, personification, and even alliteration and hyperbole to help make their stories more exciting and engaging.

In Mathematics, students have begun a Patterns Unit, where they are identifying and creating picture patterns, number sequences, and exploring how patterns grow or change. Students have loved using logic and visual thinking to solve pattern challenges.

In Humanities, we are learning about different types of industries—such as farming, manufacturing, and services—and how these sectors work together to support the community and economy. Students are starting to understand the important roles people play in making communities function.

We're proud of the learning happening every day and can't wait to share more with you soon!
