VISUAL ARTS

WITH MRS YOUNG



As we reach the end of another creative term in Visual Arts, students across the school have been busy exploring a variety of materials, techniques and artistic styles.

Our Prep/1 students have enjoyed creating colourful mixed-media fish tanks. They used watercolours to paint vibrant underwater backgrounds, rolled tissue paper into balls to create textured rocks, and used crayons and textas to design bright and imaginative fish. Students also added underwater plants using coloured paper, resulting in wonderful artworks full of colour and creativity.

Year 1/2 students also created fish tank artworks, incorporating plastic mosaic tiles to represent colourful rocks on the ocean floor. Their artworks showcased excellent creativity and attention to detail while exploring texture, colour and composition.



VISUAL ARTS

Year 3/4 students have been working hard on their impressive cardboard Picasso portraits. Students carefully planned, designed and constructed their portraits using cardboard shapes inspired by Pablo Picasso's unique artistic style. Construction is now complete, and students are excited to begin painting their creations with bright acrylic colours to bring their artworks to life.



Meanwhile, Year 5/6 students have finally completed their incredible Steam Punk Robot project. Working collaboratively, students designed and constructed large-scale robots using recycled materials before covering them with Modroc and finishing them with metallic chrome paints in gold, silver and bronze. The final artworks are enormous and look absolutely amazing. This has been a major project requiring creativity, teamwork, problem-solving and perseverance, and students should be extremely proud of their achievements. These impressive robots will soon be displayed around the school for the whole community to admire.

It has been wonderful to see students' confidence, creativity and artistic skills continue to grow throughout the term. We look forward to sharing more exciting projects next term!



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

It has been an action-packed few weeks in Physical Education, with students across the school developing a variety of skills while having fun and staying active.

Our **Prep/1 students** have been working on their **balancing skills** through a range of exciting activities and challenges. They have been learning how to control their bodies, improve stability, and move safely while developing confidence in their physical abilities.

The **Grade 1/2 students** have been participating in games and activities designed to build **teamwork and cooperation**. Through fun challenges, students have been practising communication, problem-solving, encouraging others, and working together to achieve a common goal.

The **Grade 3–6 students** have been immersed in a soccer unit, developing important game skills and strategies. Students have been practising **dribbling, shielding the ball, passing into space**, and supporting teammates by creating opportunities and assisting others during gameplay. It has been fantastic to see students applying these skills in modified matches while demonstrating teamwork, sportsmanship, and resilience.



I am proud of the enthusiasm, effort, and positive attitudes students continue to display during Physical Education lessons. It has been wonderful to see students challenging themselves, supporting their peers, and developing their confidence through physical activity.



PERFORMING ARTS

with Mrs Young



It has been a fun-filled and energetic term in Performing Arts, with students across all year levels developing their confidence, teamwork, listening skills and creativity through a variety of engaging activities and performances.



Our Prep/1 students have been focusing on listening skills, movement and following directions through a range of exciting drama and movement games. Students have particularly enjoyed activities such as Charades, Emotion Poses and Musical Chairs, where they have learned to express emotions using their faces and bodies while developing confidence in front of their peers. They have also been exploring movement to music, learning how to keep a steady beat and move in time with different rhythms.

Year 1/2 students have participated in a variety of warm-up games including Musical Chairs, the Zombie Name Game, Charades and Follow the Leader. These activities have helped students develop concentration, coordination and confidence while having plenty of fun. Students are excited to begin learning the Cha Cha Slide next term, which they will practise and eventually perform together.



Year 3/4 students have been working on carefully listening to instructions and following dance sequences. This term they have begun learning the iconic Nutbush dance, developing their coordination, timing and memory skills. Warm-up games such as Musical Chairs, Follow the Leader and The Red Letter have kept lessons active and engaging while encouraging teamwork and positive participation.



Year 5/6 students have been showcasing their creativity through drama by working collaboratively in small groups to rehearse and perform plays

based on classic fairy tales including Little Red Riding Hood, Jack and the Beanstalk and The Three Little Pigs. Students have explored characterisation, voice projection, movement and teamwork while bringing these well-known stories to life. It has been wonderful to see students grow in confidence and performance skills throughout the term, and we look forward to more exciting Performing Arts experiences next term.

PREP/1

We are almost halfway through the year and getting close to our 100 days of school celebration. We can't believe how fast time has gone and how much our students have grown in their schooling journey. Please be sure to check Compass and our classroom parent notice board for the upcoming Term 3 100 days of school celebrations.

The Prep/1s have been busy during Literacy lessons with tasks focused on fluency in their reading and writing. We are almost finished learning all our letter sounds which is beyond exciting and they have all been working so hard on their letter formation, spelling and reading with our Little Learners Love Literacy Program. We have been focused on slinky blending with 3 letter words and practising our Heart Words daily. They are showing such phenomenal growth in their writing and sentence structure; we are SUPER proud.

In Numeracy we are currently learning all about part-whole numbers through fun hands-on learning and friends of ten activities. We have been singing songs to recall our number bonds, making spotty monsters and friends of ten rainbows to consolidate all they know. They have been superstars with their partitioning.

In Science we have been learning all about the weather and seasons and their understanding around daily weather condition changes has grown so much. To extend their learning, you could have a discussion with your child around what the weather is doing today and what we should wear due to the weather, building on what we have learnt in class and practising it at home is magic.

As you are all aware, I will finish up the end of this term, and I want to take this opportunity again to thank you all for allowing me the honour to teach each of your magical children. It has been a privilege to be apart of their schooling journey and I am so very proud of the little learners they have become. I cannot express enough the gratitude I have for spending so much time teaching your children and I know each of them will achieve such wonderful things.

We hope that everyone enjoys the rest of the term, and we all have a wonderful holiday break. Well done to the Prep/1's and their families.

YEAR 1/2

As we approach the end of Term 2, we would like to commend our students on their amazing growth for the first half of the year!

This Semester, we have begun a Reading program called 'Little Learners Love Literacy' which is an explicit, sequential structured literacy program that focuses heavily on phonemic awareness, phonics, vocabulary and comprehension. The students have made huge gains in their development and are really enjoying their small group reading sessions. We hope that you can support your child by ensuring they are also reading their 'Little Learners' decodable readers which are allocated to them online every week.

In Maths this term, we have covered addition, subtraction, data, length, patterns and place value. We have given our students the opportunity to do 'hands-on' activities to transform abstract concepts into tangible experiences as well as using interactive games to build number sense, spatial reasoning and problem-solving skills. We hope you can support your child by ensuring they complete their Mathletics online tasks every week.

In addition to doing weekly History, Science, Digi Tech and Wellbeing lessons, our students have also had the unique opportunity to engage in a 'Buddy program' with the grade 5's and 6's. They have become wonderful mentors to our little grade 1's and 2's and have spent these sessions listening to them read; playing maths and literacy games like snakes and ladders and 'get out of my house' as well as teaching them team building skills by doing open ended challenges.

We have had such a busy term and hope to continue at this amazing pace next Semester!

We hope you all have a wonderful and safe mid-year break and look forward to seeing you all next term. What a fantastic and productive term it has been in Year 3/4! Students have worked incredibly hard across all learning areas and should be proud of the growth they have shown.

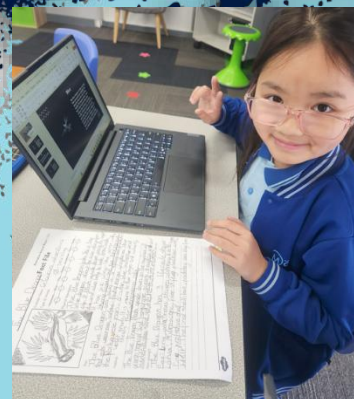
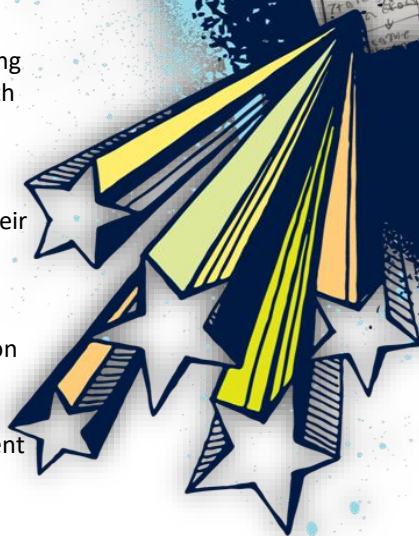
In Mathematics, students have been focusing on fractions and developing their understanding of fractions of shapes, collections and quantities. They have explored how fractions represent equal parts of a whole and have used hands-on materials and visual models to support their learning. Many students have also been challenged to investigate equivalent fractions and simplifying fractions, demonstrating excellent mathematical thinking and problem-solving skills.

In Reading, our focus has been on developing fluency. Students have been practising reading with expression, appropriate pacing and attention to punctuation to help bring texts to life. We have discussed how fluent readers sound smooth, confident and engaging when they read aloud. Students are encouraged to continue practising their reading at home by reading aloud to family members, friends or even pets! Regular reading practice helps build confidence, comprehension and a love of reading.

In Writing, students have been exploring sentence fluency and learning how authors create engaging and interesting pieces of writing. They have practised using simple, compound and complex sentences to vary their writing and make it flow more effectively. Students have also worked on expanding their vocabulary by using exciting descriptive words, synonyms and antonyms. To add creativity and fun to their writing, they have experimented with literary devices such as alliteration and hyperboles, producing some imaginative and entertaining pieces.

In Humanities, students have been learning about local government and the important role councils play within our communities. Our focus has been on the Brimbank City Council and the many services it provides for local residents. Students investigated how the council helps manage parks, playgrounds, libraries, community facilities, roads, waste collection and local events. Through discussions and inquiry activities, students developed a greater appreciation for the people and services that help keep our community running smoothly and make Brimbank a great place to live.

It has been a busy and enjoyable term filled with learning, creativity and growth. We are incredibly proud of the effort, enthusiasm and resilience students have shown throughout the term. We thank families for their ongoing support and wish everyone a safe, happy and relaxing break.

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YEAR 5/6

The Grade 5/6 students have been busy engaging in a wide range of exciting learning experiences across the curriculum this term.

In **Reading**, students have been developing their comprehension skills through **Question-Answer Relationships (QAR)**. They have been learning how to identify where answers can be found in a text and how to use evidence and their own thinking to deepen their understanding.

In **Writing**, students have been becoming expert explainers! They have been creating **explanation texts** that clearly describe how and why things happen, using strong structure, technical vocabulary, and detailed explanations.

Our **Mathematics** lessons have focused on **decimals and probability**. Students have been applying their understanding of decimals in real-world situations and exploring chance by predicting, calculating, and discussing the likelihood of different events.

In **Wellbeing**, we have been learning positive coping strategies, with a particular focus on **positive self-talk**. Students have explored how the words we say to ourselves can influence our confidence, resilience, and overall wellbeing.

In **Civics and Citizenship**, students have investigated the different roles citizens play in society and explored how volunteers make valuable contributions that help strengthen and support our community.

In **Digital Technologies**, students have stepped into the world of computer science by learning about **binary code**. They have discovered how computers communicate using combinations of 0s and 1s to store and process information.

We are incredibly proud of the enthusiasm, curiosity, and effort our students continue to demonstrate every day. Keep up the fantastic work, Grade 5/6!

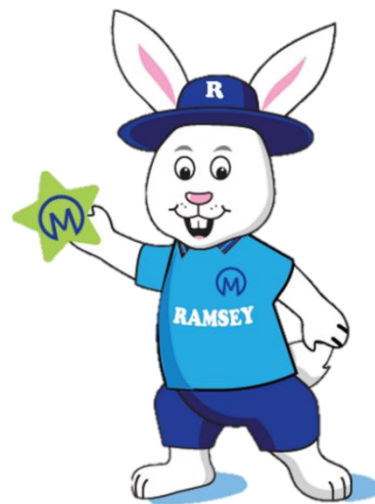

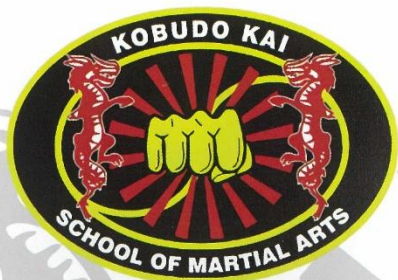
